Asthma Australia A report on the "Severe Asthma – Uncovering the Reality" study is now available – click here for more information. The report is the product of research conducted by Dr. Juliet Foster, Prof. Helen Reddel, Dr. Michael Guo and Prof. Vanessa McDonald. The work was conducted in partnership with Asthma Australia.

## AUSTRALIAN Asthma Handbook Update (Version 1.2):

The updated version of the Australian Asthma Handbook has been launched. The Asthma Handbook is the national treatment guidelines for asthma, published at asthmahandbook.org.au

Of particular relevance for severe asthma are evidence-based advice on the roles and uses of new add-on treatment options, including the monoclonal antibodies mepolizumab (anti-IL-5), omalizumab (anti-IgE).
